



Second Solar Facility Comes to Gila Bend



NEWS RELEASE (EXCERPT)

SOLON to develop and build 18MW solar power plant for Arizona Public Service

Berlin/ Tucson (USA), October 1, 2010: Tucson-based SOLON Corporation, a subsidiary of SOLON SE and one of the largest crystalline silicon solar module manufacturers and provider of turnkey solar power plants in the U.S., announced a contract with Arizona Public Service (APS) to develop, design and construct an 18-megawatt (MW) solar power plant featuring SOLON's turnkey system design, high-efficiency modules and single-axis trackers. APS, Arizona's largest and longest-serving electric utility, serves more than 1.1 million customers in the state.

Once installed this system will be one of the largest photovoltaic (PV) systems in the country, creating more than 550 local jobs during construction, and ultimately capable of generating enough solar energy to power more than 4,500 homes. Located on 145 acres of land, the system is scheduled to start construction in the first quarter of 2011 and be completed in 2011. APS will own and operate the solar production facility.

As a complete PV system provider, SOLON is handling the Gila Bend, Arizona-based project for APS every step of the way—from site development and system design, to engineering, procurement and construction. The project features SOLON's Velocity MW Solar System, which will provide 18 preconfigured, one-megawatt modular solar fields specifically designed to help utilities quickly scale to capacity.

"We are pleased to be teaming with SOLON to bring our customers more solar power. This new solar plant is part of APS' company-wide mission of creating a sustainable energy future for Arizona," said Brad Albert, General Manager Resources Acquisition and Renewable Energy for APS.

"Through our Velocity MW system, SOLON is delivering a breakthrough design for fast, reliable solar energy that will allow us to quickly scale the APS project to capacity," said

The Waterline & Fire Hydrant Project, Phase 1 of three RD projects, is completed except for a few loose ends that are being tied up. Water pressure tests have been completed as have the compaction tests; both tests were on target.

Construction of the Airport Shade Hangars has been approved and activity on the project will begin within a week and a half.

The First Things First and Care First discussions are on track and a sample agreement will be considered at the meeting scheduled for October 28th.

The Engineering Services Agreement for the Scott Avenue Waterline and Fire Hydrant Replacement Project has been approved. A Maricopa County Community Development Block Grant in the amount of \$374,000 was awarded to the Town for completion of this project.

The objective of the Arizona Kith and Kin Project is to improve the quality of childcare that friends and family provide. Though friends and family are the preferred child care providers in many small and low income communities, there are few services or support for those providing the care.

The Arizona Kith and Kin Project began in 1999 as a way to strengthen the quality of care provided by kith (friends) and kin (family). Some of the topics covered in the training include brain development, positive communication, children's activities, nutrition and health and safety issues.
