The Town of Gila Bend wants to help promote our civic pride. Code Enforcement is intended to ensure the acceptable quality of living in our neighborhoods. It helps to ensure the safety of our residents and their property. If you have received a violation notice and need assistance resolving it, please contact the Town office and we will be happy to work with you.

What is Code Compliance?

Code compliance is an effort to help keep Gila Bend safe and clean by investigating complaints and inspecting properties within the Town to enforce Town ordinances related to nuisances and zoning violations. The most common Code violations include high grass and weeds, trash and rubbish accumulation, inoperable vehicles, constructing without building permits and living or sleeping in recreational vehicles parked on residential lots.

Why is Code Enforcement Important?

Concerned citizens who take good care of their property help:

- Protect the safety and welfare of our citizenry,
- Maintain or increase property values,
- Reduce vandalism,
- Prevent fires, and
- Bolster maintenance and continued development in the Town.

The Town of Gila Bend asks that yards be kept in a neat and clean condition. Excessive weed growth can harbor rats, snakes and other vermin creating a potential health hazard for you, your family, and your neighbors. Even more so, weeds can create a fire hazard placing your home and property at risk. We would also like to remind all of those that enjoy working on "hobby vehicles" they need to be kept in a garage or back yard and be stored in a safe manner not to be a hazard to children or others. Recreational Vehicles (RV) may also be stored in a back yard but shall not be connected to any utilities including electricity, water or sewer and shall not be occupied unless in a designated RV park.

All the citizens of this great community need to do their part to keep Gila Bend beautiful!

Outstanding Rural/Small Urban Transit System

April 24, 2012

AzTa, Arizona Transit Association, and ADOT, Arizona Department of Transportation, recently issued the "Showcasing Value in Transit" 2012 Excellence Awards.

In the Outstanding Rural/Small Urban Transit System division the nominees were Ajo Transportation, NAIPTA, City of Show Low and YCIPTA. According to AzTa and ADOT this award, 'Recognizes the outstanding provider of public transportation in rural or small urbanized areas through improvements or innovations in operations efficiency and customer service. The winner: Ajo Transportation.

From the press release, "Ajo Transportation as a vital lifeline to the residents of Ajo, Gila Bend, and Buckeye. Five trips a day into the Phoenix area assures families and individuals of a safe ride. Ajo staff develops lasting friendships. Services provided are for medical purposes including dialysis, workforce, education, shopping and a wide array of social services needs. Families are able to access this vital transportation resource in order to visit other family members and in many cases the Ajo Transportation system is the only means of transportation to the riders.

The staff at Ajo Transportation is genuinely concerned about their rider's safety and the ability to provide easy access to services. When the service was in jeopardy the people overwhelmingly came to the rescue to save this vital service. Ajo Transportation serves both Maricopa County and Pima County making it a unique service that provides a link to Phoenix and Tucson, serving the small villages in rural Arizona as well as Ajo, Gila Bend and surrounding rural areas, Buckeye, Avondale and Phoenix ." Cathy Hutton accepted the award for Ajo Transportation.

It was only last year that this public transportation line, Route 685, was high on the list of public transportation services to be cut. The residents of Gila Bend, Ajo, and other communities served by this line rallied around and showed their support by voicing their concerns at public meetings and through written communications. This Excellence Award reinforces the need to keep this line and the quality of service it provides.

Council Retreat

April 19, 2012

This year's Council Retreat was held at the Gila Bend Resource Center on April 9th. Town Manager, Rick Buss, gave a presentation that highlighted some of the accomplishments of town management and staff for the current year along with goals for the new fiscal year.

Goals for the new fiscal year beginning July 1, 2012 include (but are not limited to):

Continued focus on economic development, continue policy of fiscal responsibility, affordable housing, increase of recreational programs, secure a 'P3" to promote development of industrial park, automate the R.O. plant, implement new records management and agenda management programs, upgrade and implement an accounting program, and work towards establishing a MID or EMID.

The Council thanked both management and staff for the good work.

First Annual Health Fair Held

The Care 1st Gila Bend Resource Center held their first annual Health Fair with great success. Eleven agencies participated. Turn-out was estimated at 300.
